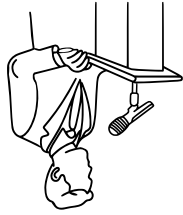
ABOLITION IS NOT JUST A SLOGAN, ITS A CALL TO ACTION

- Vote in local, state, and federal elections with immigration policy in mind.

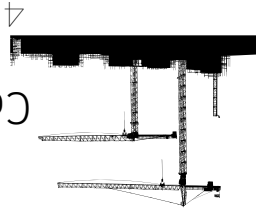

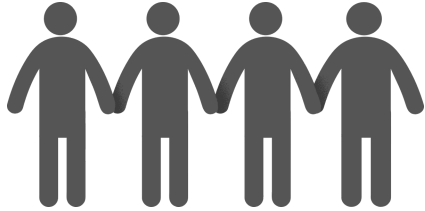

Under Capitalism, there will be no natural end to concentration camps and inhumane incarceration because they are profitable

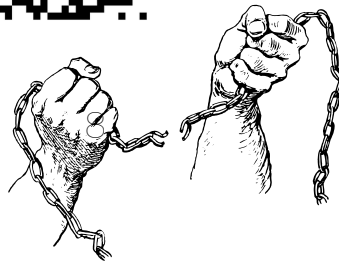
Key fact: Immigration violations are civil offenses

WHAT IS ICE ANYWAY?

- Short for US Immigration and Customs Enforcement
- Created in 2003 in the aftermath of 9/11
- Conducts raids, arrests people at homes and workplaces, detains thousands daily, and carries out deportations.

ICE has two primary divisions:

- **Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO)** – arrests, detention, deportation.
- **Homeland Security Investigations (HSI)** – investigates transnational crime, trafficking, financial crimes.

Detainees are held in **for-profit** facilities and the more people ICE arrests, the richer capitalists become
